We are therefore seeking a commitment from the candidates from the mainstream political parties to:

- •An enhanced role for the sector in **commissioning** services with better consultation about needs, priorities and service design; more accessible and transparent tendering processes; decisions about
- providers that value local knowledge and relationships; and monitoring that is proportionate to the funding provided.
- •Building a stronger **partnership** with the voluntary, community and faith sector by ensuring that there is a strong role for the sector in all strategic partnerships and boards.
- Investment in **community premises** owned by the Council and used by local organisations including providing long leases to allow inward capital investment and dealing with the back log of capital works in premises. Buildings should be suitable and safe with more transferred to ownership by the community.
- •Protect the right to campaign at a local level.

•Championing volunteering by promoting the development of high quality **volunteering** opportunities and effective brokerage arrangements

- •Supporting the **infrastructure** of the local sector so that organisations can operate effectively and continue to bring funding and other support into the borough from a wide range of sources.
- •Investment in the sector not just through commissioning but also ensuring that a significant proportion of Community Infrastructure Levy is allocated to the sector and establishing a new small grants scheme so that local groups, particularly those serving the most disadvantaged communities, can access resources for their activities
- •Recognising that voluntary organisations serving disadvantaged/vulnerable communities are often **best placed** to reflect the views of those communities and, with adequate resources, to consult with them
